

Some history

The Isola 2000 resort opened in 1972.

The idea for a resort arose in 1947, following the Second World War and due to the Italian military road that joined Isola to Vinadio via the Col de la Lombarde where the new border was located.

It all began when an Englishman, on discovering the wonderful site at Chastillon, decided to build a winter sports resort there. The idea gained ground until 1964, the date when the Municipal Council approved the creation of a winter sports resort.

THE 80TH MONTE CARLO RALLY

17th to 22nd January 2012

The 80th Monte Carlo Rally, part of the 2012 FIA World Rally Championship, will take place from Tuesday 17th to Sunday 22nd January, after an absence of three years.

The return of the World Championships will also mean more miles in the special stages, which will see a of 20% increase compared with 2011, the centenary year of the Monte Carlo Rally.

Regional program!

Two now classic stages ("Moulinet - La Bollène Vésubie" and "Lantosque – Lucéram") and a "Power Stage", providing bonus points for the first three teams will end the rally on Sunday

In total, the teams involved in this 80th event will compete over more than 430 kilometres of special stages and some 1300 kilometres of road sections.

Following the Rally, the 15th Monte Carlo Historic Rally will take place from Saturday 28th January to Saturday 4th February 2012.

More info... Silence on set, filming in Cannes...

The Mediterranean city has featured in more than one film, lending its sets to around twenty productions over the last 80 years. To name just a few:

1929, The Iron Mask, a silent film by Allan Dwan, starring Douglas Fairbanks, alias The King of Hollywood. Location: the Fort on Ile Sainte-Marguerite, the place where the Man in the Iron Mask was really imprisoned. 1955, filmed one year earlier, To Catch a Thief was one of Alfred Hitchcock's masterpieces.

The film reunited Cary Grant and Grace Kelly. Location: The Croisette and at the Carlton and all over the French Riviera.

1963, Mélodie en sous-sol (The Big Snatch) by Henri Verneuil who was joined by two greats from French cinema: Jean Gabin and Alain Delon. Location: Palm Beach

70 YEARS OF THE MONACO F1 GRAND PRIX

24th to 27th May 2012

It was in 1929, on 14th April at 1.30pm, under the Honorary Presidency of H.S.H. Prince Louis II, that the Monaco Grand Prix was born, due particularly to Anthony Noghes (son of the President of the Monaco Automobile Club of the time), who demonstrated great commitment in arranging to host an event of this size in the smallest European state (after the Vatican) with the support of the famous driver from Monaco, Louis Chiron.

On this date, 16 competitors started a 100-lap race of the circuit. That year, the average speed was 80.194 km per hour! After some difficult early days including several cancellations, since 1955, the Monaco Grand Prix has been one of the most anticipated races in the Formula 1 Championship.

THE 130TH ANNIVERSARY OF JUAN-LES-PINS

Enjoyed by John Dos Passos, Ernest Hemingway and Francis Scott Fitzgerald, the seaside resort of Juan-les-Pins was created in 1882 and developed at the instigation of the rich American Frank Jay Gould and Edouard Baudoin in the 1920s. Ever since, Juan-les-Pins has been the international capital of a certain "lust for life", with its many luxury hotels and nightlife, that have made it famous all over the world.


The wealthy heir of the American railroad king, Frank Jay Gould first settled in France at the turn of the century, then moved to Juan-les-Pins accompanied by his wife Florence Lacaze in 1925. In partnership with Edouard Baudoin, he became involved in real estate. He financed the construction of the Provençal, a sumptuous luxury hotel in Juan-les-Pins where the celebrities of the time stayed (André Gide, Cocteau, Chaplin, Estée Lauder...) and insisted upon the construction of the Juan-les-Pins railway station. He died in Juan in 1956 leaving an estimated one hundred million dollar fortune. Today, the pine forest at Juan-les-Pins bears his name, Pinède Gould.

30 YEARS OF THE PALAIS DES FESTIVALS CANNES

This history of the Palais des Festivals et des Congrès in Cannes is inextricably linked to that of the Film Festival which began in 1946. In order to host this flagship event, a building was first constructed in 1949 on the Boulevard de la Croisette, on the site of the current JW Mariott Cannes. Faced with the growing success of the Festival and the emergence of business tourism especially with the first MIP TV events from 1965, in 1979, the City of Cannes decided to build a new facility on the site of the Municipal Casino.

Opened in 1982, over the years, the current Palais des Festivals et des Congrès has established itself as one of the most competitive locations for hosting major international events.



The French Riviera, famous for the world's most beautiful light, features magnificent sites for maritime pleasures. Revel in the beauty, the relaxation and the dream..., let yourself be nourished by treatments that are both soothing and surprising depending on yourmoods and your desires, put to sea with boat trips or simply enjoy strolls along the coast...

HIKING ALONG THE CAPES

Stroll along the length of the coast. Let yourself be charmed by the beauty of the setting. The coastal paths follow the contour of the capes, Cap Martin, Cap d'Ail, Cap Ferrat, Cap d'Antibes... the lles de Lérins which inspire peace and splendour...

The fortifications, lighthouses and villas literally on the water's edge are also not to be missed...

CAP MARTIN

This seaside path presents 3km, 45 minutes through typically Mediterranean vegetation comprised of broom, myrtle, pistachio trees and Aleppo pines. It invites you to followin the footsteps of Nietzche or Corbusier, discovering his tiny beach cottage or "cabanon" on the path.

CAP D'AIL

A wonderful 3.6km path connecting Mala beach to Marquet beach. This coastal walk of about 1 hour allows you to discover the wealth of flora and geology as well as the architecture of the "Belle Epoque" villas.

CAP FERRAT

11km of coastal paths (approximately 2 ½ hours) for the tour of millionaires' peninsula, a true haven of tranquillity with sumptuous villas. The Sainte Hospice walk (45mins) bordered by Aleppo pines is not to be missed. Another path (approximately 1 hour), connects Lilong cove to Passable beach and you can get to Port de Saint-Jean using the Roy path stretching past the former property of King Léopold II of Belgium. Limestone creeks and cliffs line this coastalwalkwith luxurious vegetation.

CAP D'ANTIBES

An exceptional 2.7km coastal walk (approximately 1½ hours) along the wild coast, battered by the tides. Lined with Aleppo pines, this path allows you to discover the southern point of the peninsula between Antibes and Juan-les-Pins and its sanctuary. Notre-Dame de la Garoupe, revealing some of the most beautiful views on the French Riviera.



From peaks towering over 3,000 metres above sea-level to the plains of the Pre-Alps, cross country and alpine skiing enthusiasts can take advantage of more than 660 kilometres of trails in sunny landscapes offering an incomparable range of settings: mountain pastures and forests, the majesty of the high peaks and picturesque perched villages, such is the variety of the Alpes Maritimes.

The Alpes-Maritimes boasts 3 international resorts (Valberg, Auron and Isola 2000) and 11 small family resorts all over the Massif. Their assets in terms of snow and sun are guaranteed just a 1 ½ - hour drive from the coast!

After skiing? There is plenty of choice...

Practice some extreme sports including ice climbing, dog sledding, igloo building in the Mercantour or more simply snowshoeing, ice driving, outings in a horse-drawn carriage or even a few fitness sessions.

MERCANTOUR NATIONAL PARK

Created in 1979, this was the last of the 9 French national parks. This protected land of 68,500 hectares extends over more than 120km from the Col de Tende to the Ubaye. It fulfils two essential roles, protecting the natural environment and welcoming and informing visitors interested in nature tourism.

The open-air temple of Mont Bégo which rises to 2,872m at its highest point divides the land into 2 valleys sheltering an archaeological treasure of over 30,000 rock engravings. These are the Vallée des Merveilles and the Val de Fontanalbe which were classified as Historical Monuments in 1989.

In this spectacular landscape, shaped by glaciers around 10,000 years ago and littered with a multitude of lakes, bronze age shepherds (1,800 - 700 years B.C) marked their presence on the rocks. Site visits: free using the authorised paths or with an accredited guide.

Facts about the Mercantour National Park

- Surface area: 2,147 km over 150km of land.
- 6 valleys: Verdon, Var-Cyans, Ubaye, Tinée, Vésubie, Roya-Bévéra.
- Altitude: from 490m to 3,143m (Mont Gélas).
- Main peaks and passes: Mont Gélas (3,143m), Mont Pelat (3,051m), Mont Bego (2,872m), Mont Mounier (2,817m). Col de la Bonette (2,862m, highest road pass in Europe), Col de la Cayolle (2,326m), Col de Larche (1,191m), Col de Tende (1,871m).
- Main lakes: Lac d'Allos, Lac Vert, Lac Noir, Lac Nègre, Lac de l'Agnel, Lac Long.
- Main rivers: the Roya, the Tinée, the Vésubie, the Var, the Bévéra, the Verdon, the Cians, the Bachelard, the Ubaye.
- Fauna: 58 mammal species, including 7 wild hoofed animals, the wolf, 153 bird species, 25 reptile species, over 10,000 insect species.
- Flora: 2,000 plant species, including 200 rare and 30 native species. Greatest national diversity.







Touring the countryside is one of the key features of the region's attractiveness in terms of tourism. By exploiting its topography (mountains and coast), the Alpes-Maritimes can provide many pedestrian, horse and cycling tourist paths or road routes and is one of the most highly prized areas for

The CRT supports the development of facilities set up by the Regional Council making it possible to promote this type of tourism which is booming.

The mountain railway lines complement other transport methods and enrich the experience of the routes through a multi-transport offer (train - hiking or train - cycling).

TOURIST ROUTES

THE ROUTE OF THE GREAT ALPS

Foreseeing the tremendous development in automotive tourism, the "Touring Club de France" devised this route in 1909, linking Lake Geneva to the Mediterranean Sea, from Thonon to Menton, over the main Alpine passes. 600km via 3 National Parks (Vanoise, Ecrins, Mercantour), with a 15,000m height difference.

The Route of the Great Alps and its 16 mountain passes, 6 of them higher than 2,000m above sea level, have offered prestigious victories to cyclists in the Tour de France.

In the Riviera, this historic route runs through Valberg, St-Martin-Vésubie, Sospel and Menton.

LA VIA ALPINA

The first hiking itinerary linking 8 countries in the Alpine Arc was inaugurated in June 2002. It follows existing trails between the Principality of Monaco and Trieste via France, Italy, Switzerland, Liechtenstein, Germany, Austria and Slovenia.

This route reinforces the Alpine identity and that of the regions it crosses. The CRT Riviera Cote d'Azur is an active partner in this project initiated by French association La Grande Traversée des Alpes, since eight stopovers along Via Alpina are located in the Alpes-Maritimes, from Col de la Lombarde (Isola 2000) to La Turbie.

LA ROUTE NAPOLÉON


"Heroic and legendary, it marks the beginning of the fantastic cavalcade of the Hundred Days".

Route Napoleon retraces the former Emperor Napoleon's historic march from Golfe-Juan in 1815 after his return from the Isle of Elba. The Route crosses the hinterland of Grasse, then follows Highway N85 through the Alps to Digne and Grenoble.

Information points recall the main stages through the splendid Provencal landscapes: Cannes, Grasse, Saint-Vallierde-Thiey, Escragnolles, Séranon, Le Logis du Pin, Castellane... Laffrey and Grenoble.

Every year, on the first Sunday in March, Vallauris Golfe-Juan commemorates the Emperor's landing: a show not to be missed.

HIGHLIGHT

LA BONETTE-RESTEFOND: THE HIGHEST ROAD IN EUROPE

The journey between Nice and Barcelonnette can be made via the Restefond Pass at an altitude of 2,802m. Leaving the Riviera coastline, the track crosses the plains of the River Var to the Mescla Gorge and Tinée Valley. A unique view over the Alpes d'Azur unfurls beneath the highest point of this 150-km trek: the peak of La Bonette, above St-Dalmas-le-Selvage, culminating at 2,862m.

WALKING AND WAR HERITAGE...

THE AUTHION CIRCUIT

Pilgrimage to the sites of deadly combat in 1794 and 1945. Set off from La Roya and continue on either Piste de la Maglia or Piste du Calros to enjoy a breathtaking view: to the north across the Massif des Merveilles, the Mercantour and the Italian Alps; to the south across the Riviera dei Fiori and the Côte d'Azur coastlines. Access the fortified Authion-Turini Massif via three valleys: La Roya, La Bévéra and La Vésubie. The Turini Circuit threads its way through fortifications constructed between 1920 and 1940: Les Mille Fourches, La Forca, Cabanes Vieilles and Plan Caval.

FORTS ALONG THE TENDE PASS

Pistes de Marguareis or La Route de l'Amitié.

French forts on the Maginot Line in the Alps, and the Italian fortifications opposite them, can be explored along two itineraries crossing alpine pastures.

French side: access via the former salt route or the Piste de Castérino.

Italian side: access via the tarmacked road starting at the northern exit of the Tende tunnel. A panoramic view of the entire valley unfolds below the imposing Fort Central. The circuit takes in Fort Pernante, Le Fort de la Margherie and Fort Giaure.



In the vicinity of Sospel, discover constructions on the Maginot Line built in 1930 to stem the arrival of the Italians: Fort Saint Roch, Fort du Barbonnet and the Agaisen construction on the southern Maginot Line.

FORT ON CAP MARTIN

A part of the Maginot Line, built after 1930, the Fort was involved in combat between French and Italian troops in June 1940. Like all elements in the Maginot Line, it was designed and equipped to be completely self-sufficient. It was manned by 343 soldiers and 11 officers.

FORT DU MONT ALBAN - NICE

In the middle of the 16th century, Nice was a key point in the defence system protecting the Savoy States from invaders. In 1557, the Mont Alban fort was built on the orders of Emmanuel Philibert, Duke of Savoy, by André Provana de Leyni, from plans by Domenico Ponsello. It predates the Vauban fortifications which saved it from demolition by Louis XIV and was then used as a model. The remaining surrounding walls and ditches were classified as historic monuments in 1913. Despite the numerous attacks which it suffered and in the absence of any major modifications since its construction, it remains a perfectly-preserved and precious example of 16th century structures.





With their sunny accents, market gardeners call out to those who are undecided. Attracted by the fresh produce, the region's greatest Chefs go to these markets to make their selection, transforming these Mediterranean goods into genuine gourmet master

The Comté de Nice is also renowned for its wines, among the great vintages of Provence. Especially the wine of Bellet, a small vineyard of great renown, with original aromatic whites and sumptuous reds.



So, it's no accident that the French Riviera has 36 starred restaurants (2011 awards). They all contribute to the region's prestigious position on the gourmet map of France.





"cuisine nissarde, respecting tradition" brand has been created to protect promote authentic and Niçoise cuisine.

From family to gourmet restaurants, the restaurateurs that hold the brand (indicated by the brand's sticker in their window) offer you the opportunity to discover traditional recipes from authentic Niçoise cuisine.

- > Pissaladière: onion tart with fillets of anchovy and black
- > Socca: crêpe made with chickpea flour, water and olive oil and baked in a wood-burning oven.
- > Salade niçoise: anchovy, tuna, tomato, green pepper, celery, hardboiled egg, black olives and a dribble of olive oil for seasoning (artichoke hearts and baby broad beans can be added in season).
- > Pan-Bagnat: round loaf of bread filled with Salade Niçoise and onions or spring onions.
- > Bagna Cauda: raw vegetables dipped in a hot fondue of olive oil, garlic and anchovy.
- > Soupe au pistou: vegetable soup with carrots, turnips, cabbage leaves, courgettes, beans, leeks, potatoes, garlic, salt, pepper and lard, served with pesto (paste made with basil and olive oil).
- > Beignets de fleurs de courgettes: courgette flower fritters.
- > Petits farcis: tiny vegetables (tomatoes, courgettes, onions, mushrooms, courgette flowers, bell peppers and aubergines) stuffed with lard, egg, basil, garlic and parmesan.
- > Tourte aux blettes: a sweet tart with Swiss chard (only the green of the leaves is used), raisins and pine nuts.
- > Dried figs.
- > Candied fruit.
- > Ganses (fritters).


